Practices can also refer patients to pharmacy in addition to the Care at the Chemist minor ailments scheme where following a Pharmacist consultation we can issues items for: Athletes Foot, Cold Sores, Constipation, Cough, Fever, Cystitis, Dermatitis, Diarrhoea, Bacterial Conjunctivitis, Allergies / Hay fever, Headlice, Pain, Acid Reflux, Insect Bites, Mouth Ulcers, Nappy Rash, Teething, Threadworm, Thrush, Warts and Verruca's.

Urinary Tract Infection (UTI)	For non-pregnant women aged between 18-65 years Who have not been treated for a UTI recently with antibiotics in the last 6 months. • Dipstick testing is not required.	 No Males No vaginal discharge Not pregnant or breastfeeding Don't have Diabetes Mellitus 	Nitrofurantoin
2. Treatment of Superficial Eye Infections	Child aged 3 months and under 2 years presenting with a red irritated/sticky eye Carer has already tried self-care treatment for 7 days including the following situations: Bacterial conjunctivitis (muco-purulent) External and internal stye	 Babies/infants <u>under 3 months</u> of age 	Chloramphenicol 0.5% Eye Drops

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3. Mild skin conditions	Adults and children 1+ years presenting with acute dermatitis, mild eczema or insect bite reactions.		Children under 1 year of age	Hydrocortisone 1%
4. Treatment of Oral Candidiasis Thrush in Infants from 1 to 23 months of age	Babies over 1 month and under 2 years of age presented by parent/carer in the pharmacy with signs of oral thrush. e.g. white plaques which do not move (not to be confused with milk curds in the mouth).	-	. If this episode is a recurrence within the last 8 weeks.	Nystatin oral suspension
